Class Plan

- 1. **(10 Minutes) Debrief Homework**, focusing in particular on reviewing and defining the five influential ideas identified in the reading:
 - 1. Opposition to absolute monarchy
 - 2. Separation of powers
 - 3. Liberty and individual rights
 - 4. Equality
 - 5. Free-market capitalism
- 2. **(20 minutes) A Look at Op-Eds:** In groups, have students peruse Op-Ed articles and identify one that argues for (or against!) one of the five influential ideas.
- 3. (15 minutes) Activity: Have each group post to a Padlet, Google Jamboard, or similar tool, where they:
 - 1. Include link to the op-ed article they found
 - 2. Identify the main argument of the op-ed
 - 3. Identify which of the five Enlightenment ideas is being discussed
 - 4. Support these identifications with quotations
